CONTENT

Tuesday, July 6th:
Clyde Vincent’s “Mental Map / ASL Discourse” workshop will cover orientation, exercises and performances that will help develop the necessary skills for mental mapping. The objectives of the workshop are to cover the following elements; identify the chronological order of the story; outline the main point of the story; produce the details and categorize the chunks which give direction to the structure of the story. The goal of the workshop is to help use more visualization and conceptualization rather than memory based on words alone. By using ASL discourses, we will learn how to narrate a story in proper sequences or start with general information. Some practices will be performed with a main point, body, recap and narrations. We will practice how to use different ways of opening and closing a story.
